As described in the Law JD tuition proposal, after a full review of key competitor tuition rates, the Dean determined that in order to maintain program quality, cover rising operational costs, and continue to invest in the success of the students, she recommends aligning the LLM tuition (resident and non-resident are the same) with the JD non-resident tuition. This will mean an 8.4% tuition increase for the LLM program. At the Dean's Student Advisory Council (DSAC) on October 24, 2023 meeting, we presented a 5% increase proposal. LLM students are generally in the degree program for only one year, so this typically impacts new students and recruitment more (though this is changing with additional electives being added). Given the small cohort impacted, we will discount the additional tuition increase above 5% (i.e., 3.4% increase) to align the JD non-resident and LLM tuition for already enrolled students. The Law School will submit merit scholarship/discounts of approximately \$1,833 for a full-time LLM student continuing the entire academic year 24-25 (if only fall 2024 \$916.50 for full time)).

JD summer tuition had fallen out of alignment with the academic year. This was not intentional. Therefore, we are submitting a proposal to bring the tuition schedule back in alignment. This is a significant one-year increase of 24.4% for residents and 43.8% for non-residents. To minimize the impact of this alignment on current students, only the proposed 5% increase will be applied to their summer tuition. The Law School will submit summer merit scholarship/discounts of \$397.95 per summer credit hour for resident JD students and \$866.25 per summer credit hour for non-resident students for continuing students in Summer 2025 (future across the board increase will still apply for Summer 2026, but rising 3Ls will still receive the lower summer rate). The rates above will apply to students admitted in Fall 2024 for Summer 2025.
