The Dean previewed a 6-8% tuition increase to the Dean's Student Advisory Council (DSAC) at the October 22, 2019 meeting of the group. The DSAC is comprised of elected and appointed student leaders from both the JD and the CRES Masters program, and is the body with whom the Dean consults each year about tuition, among other things. The Dean also held a student Town Hall on October 24, 2019 for all students to discuss possible tuition and fee increases in addition to meeting with her senior leadership team and discussing proposed changes with the faculty at their meeting on November 22, 2019. After these meetings and a full review key competitor tuition rates, the Dean determined that in order to maintain program quality, cover rising operational costs, and continue to invest in the success of the students, she must recommend a 7% tuition increase for the JD program.

A 7.0% tuition increase for our JD program positions the law school at mid tuition range compared to peer institutions. This comparison includes the law schools at Seattle University, Lewis and Clark, Willamette, University of Washington, Colorado, and Gonzaga, in addition to several others. There is no way to know what these peer institutions will do with their tuition models for the next academic year but as far as we know, they do not include Bar Prep as part of their cost of attendance.
